

manager's corner

Good Day, Solerans!

They say we have more than 300 days a year of sunshine and I believe it. We have had just an awesome spring and I'm loving it. We certainly should have no vitamin D deficiency! I hope you're enjoying all this sunshine as well.

The 2018 Reserve Study Ad Hoc Committee was appointed at the April Board of Directors meeting. This committee will work with and oversee the Reserve Studies for both Solera and the Villas. For those that might not be familiar with a reserve study, this is a report that's produced every five years, as required by Nevada law, that lists all the assets and common elements of the association. Each asset or common element is reviewed for the condition, life expectancy, maintenance needs and replacement costs.

A plan is included for when items will need major maintenance or may just wear out and the costs associated. These studies give the Board of Directors the guidance they need to fund the reserve accounts. The goal is to ensure that the funds are available when they are needed to keep the common elements in good condition and serving the community.

The committee is co-chaired by Richard Kranzler and Marci Madine of the Board of Directors. Members of the Finance Committee, as well as other homeowners, are also on the committee. Management representatives are on the committee to provide information and assistance too.

Once the reserve studies have been completed and reviewed by the committee, the studies will come to the Board of Directors for approval at a regular BOD meeting. This will probably happen in July, although the schedule could change.



Meetings of this committee are open to homeowners. Their next meeting is scheduled for June 13, 2018, at 6:00 p.m.. Check the website, soleranews.com for details.

Speaking of committee meetings, I think it's worth reminding everyone that all committee meetings are
open for homeowners to attend,
with one exception. The Covenants
Committee meetings are not open
to homeowners. This is because we
are dealing with violations of the
rules and are required by law to be
private. Thankfully, Solera is such a
great community, with homeowners that are happy to adhere to the
rules, that we almost never have
to call anyone to a hearing before
the committee.

Committee meetings are listed on the calendar in the Solera Star each month and are usually held in the MGM Conference Room. So feel free to come on in and check out what's happening. We had another great "Nite at the Races" event on May 5th. We had a sell-out crowd of homeowners and guests, eager to place those bets and root for their horse. It's so much fun to see how everyone gets into the spirit of the night and enjoys the event. Your Board President, Frank Fimiano, heads this event and puts in a lot of work to make sure that it's a success each year.

As June turns into July and August, one thing will be certain. The days will get longer and hotter. We had a pretty mild winter, so we may be in store for a very hot summer. STOP THE BLEED

Launched in October of 2015 by the White House, "Stop the Bleed" is a national awareness campaign and a call to action. Stop the Bleed is intended to cultivate grassroots efforts that encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.

No matter how rapid the arrival of professional emergency responders, bystanders will always be first on the scene. A person who is bleeding can die from blood loss within five minutes, therefore it is important to quickly stop the blood loss. Those nearest to someone with life-threatening injuries are best positioned to provide first care. According to a recent National Academies of

Science study, trauma is the leading cause of death for Americans under age 46.

Remember to be aware of your surroundings and move yourself and the injured person to safety, if necessary.

Architectural Review Committee "ARC"

Your Architectural Review Committee (ARC) team has received an abundance of applications for the installation of Satellite Dishes, TV Antennas, and Wireless Cable Antennas. In this article, we will be covering Satellite dish guidelines for quick reference, and in our July 2018 article, we will cover antennas.

- Size maximum of one meter (39.37 inches) in diameter.
- Location for single-family detached homes, provided adequate reception can be obtained, a satellite dish or antenna must be ground mounted or mounted at the base plate of the dwelling unit in the rear or side yard with approved screening. A satellite dish or antenna may also be mounted on the lowest possible point of the caves on the dwelling unit if ground mounting does not allow for adequate reception. If installed in a side yard, they shall be mounted no closer to the front property lines than the front edge of the garage or house.
- Equipment all roof and wall mounted installation hardware, including but not limited to cable, wiring, mounting brackets, nuts, bolts, etc., shall be painted the same color as the surface on which it is mounted on. Any transmission cable from the satellite dish or antenna to the house, not attached to the house, shall be underground.
- **Screening** a ground mounted or base plate mounted satellite dish must be screened or disguised by materials such as shrubs, imitation boulders, etc., appropriate to the site as approved by the ARC.

PLEASE NOTE: For Villas, provided adequate reception can be obtained, a satellite dish or antenna may be mounted on the lowest possible point of the caves, or the wall at the rear of the owner's unit. A satellite dish may not be installed on another owner's unit, on any roof, or in any common area.

Reminder: Please leave any yellow flags placed by the ARC team in your front yard. They will pick them up when final inspection is performed/completed. Be kind to one another and as a courtesy to your neighbors and our community, please pick-up after your pets. Your neighbors will appreciate your responsibility as a pet owner.



Germs at the gym: Keep yourself safe! You've probably heard that regular workouts can strengthen immunity, but even the cleanest gym can be an unexpected source of germs that can make you sick. Spending just a few seconds disinfecting equipment before you use it may help stave off the sniffles (more than half of cold and flu viruses are transmitted by touching your eyes or nose after handling a contaminated area). Don't rely on your gym's bottle of disinfectant solution. Like a pen in a doctor's office, the outside of the bottle can be riddled with germs. Make sure you rub down the buttons and handles and don't forget yoga mats and free weights; they're just as likely as cardio machines to carry bugs. And try to avoid rubbing your face until you can wash your hands after your workout.

FIRST AID STATIONS AVAILABLE

Thankfully, we only occasionally need first aid at the Community Center. But when we do have a need, did you know that we have first aid stations in both buildings? We have signs above the doorways pointing to the location of the first aid supplies.

We have a variety of items in each location which include band-aids, gauze, wraps, minor medications, heat and cold packs, sprays for burns, saline solution and other items.

In the Recreation Center, the First-Aid Station is at the Monitors Desk. In the Clubhouse, the First-Aid Station is in the Staff Room above the sink.

We would ask that if the staff is available, please allow them to handle the first-aid situation and provide the needed supplies. If the staff isn't available, homeowners are welcome to provide the needed assistance.

We also have an AED in the Recreation Center. The automated external defibrillator (AED) is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation, and is able to treat them through the application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm.

This is an expensive device, so we also ask that the staff handle this situation. The staff has been trained in its use and also in CPR.

It's important to have the right equipment and supplies on hand during an emergency and this is the goal with these stations. If you have any questions about the locations or use of these stations, just ask!

MIZU FITNESS

Mizu Fitness was developed by a senior primarily for seniors. His goal was to provide exercises that mimic Tai Chi and freestyle martial arts routines using the natural resistance of water to enhance strength, speed, flexibility, and balance. The movements are slow to moderate and can result in less stress on participants' knees and back than "land-based" exercises. You need an open mind and willingness to try something new. Classes are held in the pool once a week, Thursdays, 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. You should obtain your doctor's approval before participating, as in any other new exercises. POWER WALKERS

OPEN THE DOOR, but rather speak through it.

According to the Henderson Municipal Code 4.12.110* by posting any of the following signs:

"No Trespassing," "No Peddlers," No Canvassers," "No Solicitors," by the entry of your home you can prohibit strangers from ringing your doorbell or knocking on your door. These signs must be visible with legible letters at least ¾" in height. These signs, in a variety of formats are available at office supply and home improvement stores.

If a stranger ignores your posted signs and comes to your door:

- speak through the door;
- inform them they are trespassing;
- and that you have called the police.

Call the Police, 911 if it is an emergency, or 311 if the person has left your property. This person has been in violation of the law and the police will respond to your phone call.
